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Film Grants 101

What is the one thing that ALL great filmmakers *have* to have?

Creativity? Charm? A cinematic vision?

The answer, my friends, is money! (I know, I'm sorry)

As artists, our collective reputation when it comes to money is...not so stellar. This is unfortunate, because filmmaking is expensive AF. Luckily, there is a way to raise funds for your next big project without tap dancing for tips in the subway (although you might just have to do that too). We're talking, of course, about FILM GRANTS.

Film grants can be a filmmaker's best friend when it comes to finance. They are usually given out by governmental organizations, companies or festivals, and come in many forms—from sums of money to complementary equipment for shoots. The general goal of these grants is to allow filmmakers to create work that reflects the goals of the granting organization. For example, some grants give funds to filmmakers from marginalized groups, like women and minorities. Other grants are designed to fund films that tackle certain themes or issues that the creators of the fund feel are important. But no matter what the specifics may be, grants ultimately exist to give filmmakers (like YOU!) the opportunity to fund their independent works and unleash their creative greatness into the world!

Application Tips

So you found a grant that looks good—what now? Although every grant is different, there are a few steps you can take to get a head start on the competition.

1. Do your Research

Check out the website of the organization offering the grant you have an eye on. What is their mission? What is their goal? Often sites list links to the projects of previous winners. Take the time to be sure your project would fit in among their past grantees. Don't waste your time applying for something you aren't actually eligible for.

2. Follow the Rules

Your proposal and/or application for a grant should follow ALL rules and guidelines set forth by the granting organization. Look through the guidelines closely, and then look again. Some grants require applications in PDF form. Some old-school granters may want hardcopies of proposals (crazy, I know). Most organizations WILL and DO rule out your application for any minor infraction. Odds are they have a LOT of proposals to sort through, and will take your mistake as a sign of apathy. If you can't bother to do it right, they won't bother to read it.

3. Know your Project's Purpose

All grant-giving organizations look for different things in their grantees, but EVERYONE will want to know your project's *purpose*. Take time to meet with your creative team and find a cohesive way to construct your pitch. If your application lacks direction, the only place it's going is into the "no" pile.

4. Be Bold

At FatChix, we are all about being bold—and we think you should be too! Take what you learned from Tip #1 and use it to your advantage. Make it clear in your application that you have done your homework, and that you WANT THIS MONEY OPPORTUNITY! If you're really feelin' it, grab somebody's contact info off the site and shoot them an email. Leave them your name and info, and ask them a question about the grant to show your interest (just be sure that your question cannot be answered from the website!!!). Getting your name involved in the process, even in a small way, can never hurt.

5. Be Someone YOU'D Wanna Fund.

If you were in a grant-giving position, what would you look for in a grant candidate? Keep this in mind as you apply. Be sure to come off as the dedicated, intelligent, and innovative creator that you are! A grant-giver's worst fear is to give money to someone who might blow their cash on something stupid, or leave a project halfway through. So take the time to let your planning skills, potential, and dedication shine through. Repeat that to yourself. Planning skills, Potential, Dedication. These three points are important to emphasize clearly, because they paint you as someone who has their sh*t together and isn't going to abandon ship—the ideal candidate for a grant!
